






This chart is intended to provide members with general equivalents between USAF and Corporate Uniforms in each uniform category. Uniform wear patterns, accoutrements, hats, outer garments, etc. are not represented here. See the appropriate paragraphs in CAPM 39-1 for specific wear information for that uniform.

** Per Table 1-1: “The Corporate Working uniform may be worn in a flying, field or mission setting when USAF-style Class B or Aviator Shirt would be worn.” This does not mean that the Corporate Working Uniform is the equivalent of USAF-style Class B or Aviator Shirt uniforms for the purposes of the minimum uniform.
