| Grade Insignia and CAP cutout for enlisted - Epaulets sleeves w/pips or diamonds for cadet officers | 1 | Set |
| Service coats - cadets - don't bring them because you can't wear them | | |
| CAP Name Plate (blue for cadets, grey for seniors) with backing | 1 | Each |
| Ribbons and ribbon holder (rack) with backing | 1 | Set |
| CAP Tie Tack or CAP Tie Bar (Males only) | 1 | Each |
| Optional: Gold Shoulder Cord for those that made 3.00/4.00 or better in school. If you bring the gold cord, you will have to present an original report card during check in to be able to wear the gold cord during encampment. No other cords will be allowed. | | |
| Optional: Shirt/sock garters | 1 | Set |

| BDU Uniforms (Summer weight - it is too hot to wear winter weight uniforms) | Quantity | Unit |

| BDU Blouse with "Civil Air Patrol" name tape (squadron patch optional) and reverse US Flag | 3 | Each |

| Plain brown crew neck tee-shirts (no black tee-shirts, no squadron tee-shirts) | 3 | Each |
| BDU cover (no squadron hats/caps, no "ranger rolls" on covers) | 1 | Each |
| Note: For cadet officers, cloth grade will be sewn on collars and covers, no metal pips or diamonds on blouses or covers are allowed. Refer to CAPM31-1 for proper placement of cloth grade. | | |
| Note: For cadet enlisted, two grade insignia devices are required. | | |
| Navy Blue BDU woven belt w/subdued buckled (no chrome) and subdued tip (no chrome) | 1 | Each |
| Black socks for wear with boots | 5 | Pairs |
| Blouser bands | 1 | Pair |
| Combat boots - highly polished - already broken in - NOT NEW! | 1 | Pair |
| Small personal first aid kit to be carried on person | 1 | Each |
| Note: Weave on cover, blouse and trousers shall match. | | |
| Optional: Suspenders (woodland camouflage) that can be worn under the blouse to help hold up the trousers. | 1 | Pair |

| Black Athletic shorts - proper length is mid thigh. When touching toes with straight arms and straight legs, no cheeks showing. | 1 | Pair |

| Other equipment (Everything the cadet brings must be labeled with their last name, first initial and last 4 digits of their CAP ID number) | Quantity | Unit |

| The means to carry 2 quarts (minimum) of water on your person. This can be done with two canteens using a web belt, or with a water pack (sometimes called a CamelBak). This is not a large backpack. | 1 | Means |
| Orange safety vest (preferably reflective) | 1 | Each |

| Sleeping Gear: | Quantity | Unit |

| Athletic shorts - proper length is mid thigh. When touching toes with straight arms and straight legs, no cheeks showing. Note: You will want these to be a different pair than your PT shorts. | 1 | Pair |
| Tee Shirts with sleeves (no black tee shirts) | 7 | Each |

| Other Clothing: | Quantity | Unit |
|---|----------|------|
| Casual Clothing (jeans, pullover shirt) Civilian attire must be solid colored clothing. Advertising or vulgar statements of any sort will not be permitted. | 2 | Sets |

| Swimsuit (no "Speedos") must have a drawstring and come to mid thigh. No cutoffs | 1 | Each |

| Swimsuit - must be modest (no thongs) "tank suit" or two piece with "full rear coverage" | 1 | Each |

| Over the counter medications: In their original container with a signed note from the parent/guardian (or physician) describing the reason, the name of the medication, the frequency of dosing, and the size of dosing. |

| No pornography (Playboy, Hustler, etc.) |

| No cell phones (if you bring them, you must turn them in - they will be returned at the end of the encampment) |
| No pagers (if you bring them, you must turn them in - they will be returned at the end of the encampment) |
| No hand held game devices |
| No IPOD's |
| No candy or snacks |
| No soda pop |
| NO ALCOHOL |
| NO TOBACCO PRODUCTS |
| Don't bring more than \$20 cash (you should not need any cash) |
| Basically - if it is not on the list of things to bring, don't bring it. If you are not sure - ask your squadron commander to ask. |

| Males: Hair must be cut to conform with the requirements in CAPM39-1 grooming standards |
| Females: Hair must be arranged to conform with the requirements in CAPM39-1 grooming standards |
| Overall: Hair must be of single natural color (or dyed to be the natural color), and not be of a distracting style. |
| Cadets: If your hair does not conform to the regulations, you will not be admitted to the encampment. Refer to the attached grooming standards. |

NOTES:

1. Senior members and cadets who are 18 and older must meet CAP weight standards in order to wear the AF-style uniform.
2. A weight allowance of up to 3 pounds for clothing (excluding footwear) is authorized.
3. Height measurements do not include footwear.
4. Round up to the nearest inch.

CAP GROOMING STANDARDS

MALE

Haircut---

Tapered appearance. Hair must not touch the ears or the collar. "Block" style authorized as long as a tapered appearance is maintained.

Sideburns---

Neatly trimmed, not flared and will end with a clean shaven horizontal line.

Maximum length--

Seniors: not below lowest part of exterior ear opening.

Cadets: Not below the bottom of the ear lobe.

Bangs---

Not below eyebrows and not exposed when headgear is worn.

Mustache---

Must be neatly trimmed. Must not extend downward beyond the lip line of the upper lip or extend sideways beyond a vertical line drawn upward from the corner of the mouth.

Beards and Goatees---

Forbidden for all members wearing any of the Air Force-style uniforms.

FEMALE



Hair---

Will be neatly arranged and shaped to present a conservative feminine appearance. Hair styles that prevent the proper wearing of the service hat are not appropriate.



Barrettes, ribbons and other ornaments ---

except inconspicuous pins and combs, will not be worn in the hair when the uniform is worn.

Hair in the back may touch, but not fall below, the bottom edge of the collar.
